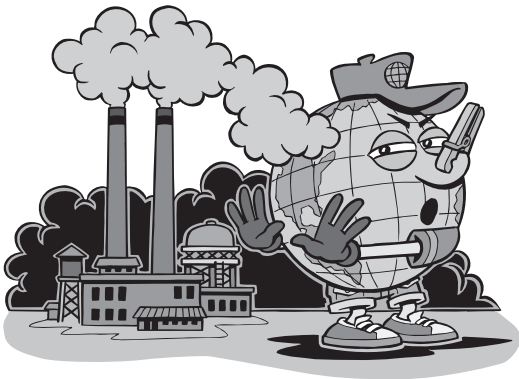


If you were in charge of the whole world, what would you do to make it a happier place?
